



SUNDAY OF THE PUBLICAN AND THE PHARISEE VENERABLE AND GOD-BEARING FATHER ANTHONY THE GREAT

Jesus Christ shared the parable of the Publican and the Pharisee with us to warn us of the great spiritual danger of arrogant self-confidence in our own righteousness, coupled with contempt for those whom we consider to be beneath us. In this way Jesus sought to protect us from the terrible spiritual sickness of Pharissee-ism.

This disease of the soul first manifests itself as absolute confidence and trust in the rightness of our own point of view and judgement; it presupposes our personal superiority over others. And this twisted expression of self confidence quickly degenerates into

uncritical self-satisfaction and self righteousness, into a kind of mindless self-admiration. It takes endless endless pleasure in the self, and in all that it does

On the Publican and the Pharisee Sunday, for the first time—and this is sung all the way up until Palm Sunday—you have these particular hymns which are sung at the service. They go like this: "Open to me the doors of repentance, O Life-giver, for my spirit rises early to pray toward your holy temple, bearing the temple of my body all defiled, but in your compassion, purify me by the loving-kindness of your mercy; lead me on the paths of salvation, O mother of God, for I have profaned my soul with shameful sins and have wasted my life in laziness, but by your intercessions deliver me from all impurity. When I think of the many evil things I have done, wretch that I am, I tremble at the fearful day of judgment, but trusting in your loving kindness like David, I cry out to you: have mercy on me, O God, according to your great mercy."

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POPE: PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL, NOT CLERGY, CAN MAKE MIRACLES HAPPEN

The prayers of the faithful, not the pope, bishops, priests or nuns, have the power to make miracles happen in the most impossible situations, Pope Francis said. Saints, like St. Monica, have proven that lives can change if people pray courageously and believe that God "can do everything," he said Jaanuary 12.

The pope recalled Hannah's tearful prayers to God for a child as he reflected on the day's first reading (1 Sm 1: 9-20) during his homily at the Mass in the Domus Sanctae Marthae. Her prayer, he said, exemplifies "the courage of a woman of faith" who prays as if she were putting everything she had on the line. "There are so many good women like that in the church," the pope said. "Let

us think of a great one, St. Monica, who with her tears was able to obtain the grace of conversion for her son, St. Augustine. There are so many who are like that."

The pope said that he saw his own personal defects in the reaction of Eli, the priest of the temple, who initially assumed Hannah's tearful pleas to God were due to drunkenness. When someone lacks heartfelt pity, he said, it is difficult to understand another who prays with anguish, like Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane.

"Jesus knew this prayer in the Garden of Olives, when the anguish and pain were so great that he sweat blood," the pope said. "And Jesus responded the same way as this woman: with meekness. At times, we pray, we ask the Lord, but so many times we do not know how to arrive precisely at that struggle with the Lord, to the point of tears, to ask for grace."

Pope Francis recalled a man in his native Argentina who prayed with that same anguish, spending an entire night praying for his daughter's healing at the gates of the Marian shrine of Lujan. Noting that the man's daughter was healed the next day, the pope said that is proof that "prayer makes miracles" happen.

"The prayers of the faithful change the church," he said. "It is not us: the pope, the bishops, the priests, the nuns who bring the church forward, it is the saints! And the saints are these people, like (Hannah). The saints are those who have the courage to believe that God is the Lord and that he can do everything."

GOD IS READY TO WELCOME US BACK INTO RIGHT RELATIONSHIP



In this Jubilee Year, Pope Francis has taken up the theme of mercy in his General Audiences.

As he started this new cycle of catecheses at the weekly audience in Paul VI Hall, he stressed that God is waiting for us, ready to forgive our sins.

Reflecting on the reading of the Book of Exodus, the Pontiff noted that God defines himself as the God of mercy, and underscored that God tells Moses that he is "the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness," (Ex 34:6).

The Hebrew word for mercy, the Holy Father also pointed out, evokes the "tender and visceral love of a mother" for her child.

"The God of mercy is also gracious, ever ready to understand and forgive. He is slow to anger, prepared to wait patiently, like a wise farmer,

for the seeds of repentance to grow in our hearts," he suggested, noting how "He abounds in steadfast love and faithfulness."

"God's love, freely given, precedes any merit on our part; his faithfulness, like that of the father in the parable of the prodigal son, has no limits," the Pope said, noting, "He waits for us, ever ready to forgive our sins and to welcome us back to a right relationship with him."

In this Year of Mercy, the Holy Father exhorted, may we turn to God with all our heart, trusting in his mercy and grace, his infinite faithfulness and love.

The Pontiff also prayed the Church's celebration of the Jubilee of Mercy will be a moment of grace and spiritual renewal for all. (D.C.L.)

∞ THE LIFE OF THE SAINTS ○ €



On January 17, we commemorate the venerable and God-bearing Father Saint Anthony the Great. Also known as Anthony of Egypt, Anthony of the Desert, and Anthony the Anchorite, he was a leader among the Desert Fathers, who were Christian monks in the Egyptian desert in the 3rd and 4th centuries AD.

Most of what we know about the life of St Anthony is in the Greek vita (Life of Antony) by Athanasius, circulated in Latin. Several surviving homilies and epistles of varying authenticity provide scant autobiographical detail.

Anthony was born near Herakleopolis Magna in Upper Egypt in 251 to wealthy parents. When he was eighteen years old, his parents died and left him with the care of his unmarried sister. In 285, he decided to follow

the words of Jesus who had said: "If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasures in heaven; and come, follow Me." (Matthew 19:21). Anthony gave his wealth to the poor and needy, and placed his sister with a group of Christian virgins, a sort of proto-nunnery at the time.

Anthony is notable for being one of the first ascetics to attempt living in the desert proper, completely cut off from civilization. His anchoritic (isolated) lifestyle was remarkably harsher than his predecessors. By the 2nd century there were also famous Christian ascetics, such as Saint Thecla. Saint Anthony decided to follow this tradition and headed out into the alkaline desert region called the Nitra in Latin (Wadi El Natrun today), about 95 km west of Alexandria, some of the most rugged terrain of the Western Desert. Later he moved to a mountain by the Nile, called Pispir, now Der el Memun, opposite Arsinoë in the Fayyum. There he lived strictly enclosed in an old abandoned Roman fort for some twenty years. While in the fort he only communicated with the outside world by a crevice through which food would be passed and he would say a few words. Saint Anthony would prepare a quantity of bread that would sustain him for six months. He did not allow anyone to enter his cell: whoever came to him, stood outside and listened to his advice. One day he emerged from the fort with the help of villagers to break down the door. By this time most had expected him to have wasted away, or gone insane in his solitary confinement, but he emerged healthy, serene, and enlightened. Everyone was amazed he had been through these trials and emerged spiritually rejuvenated. He was hailed as a hero and from this time forth the legend of Anthony began to spread and grow.

When Saint Anthony felt that the day of his departure had approached, he instructed his disciples to bury his body in an unmarked, secret grave, lest his body become an object of veneration. He stretched himself on the ground and gave up his spirit. Saint Anthony the Great lived for 105 years and departed on the year 356. He probably spoke only his native language, Coptic, but his sayings were spread in a Greek translation. He himself left no writings. His biography was written by Saint Athanasius and titled Life of Saint Anthony the Great. Many stories are also told about him in various collections of sayings of the Desert Fathers.
